## **DEPARTMENTAL NOTES: AMERICAN STUDIES**

- 1. Majors must complete this interdisciplinary program by selecting 18 semester hours in courses emphasizing American Studies (e.g., in Anthropology, Art History, Communication, Economics, Geography, History, Literature, Music, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology, and Theatre Arts). At least 6 hours must be at the 300-level.
- 2. Since a large portion of this degree program consists of required electives, it will be necessary for students to select these in consultation with the program advisor. The advisor shall initial and date all selections for the student's advisement file. It is suggested that the student retain a copy reflecting the approved courses. Graduation in this degree program will require that the student complete successfully the approved courses.
- 3. This program can accommodate a double major in History or English. Provisional certification in secondary education (7-12) may be earned in either Social Studies or English by completing the certification options available with these Bachelor of Arts programs. Consult the appropriate curriculum guide sheets for details.
- 4. **A maximum of 51 semester hours** in either History or English may be included within the required 120.
- 5. Students may take Amst. 201: ("subtitle") for credit toward the major twice, as long as the subtitle is different in each case.
- 6. A grade of C- or better is required in all courses submitted in fulfillment of the 40 hours of the major.
- 7. Electives must be selected from at least three different departments.
- 8. Majors must earn a minimum of 15 semester hours in courses at the 300-level.
- 9. A maximum of 9 semester hours may be taken at the 100-level.
